DPDS Architecture is delighted to have helped Prospect Hospice achieve their “Heart of the Hospice”.

An existing under utilised courtyard has been transformed into a vibrant area for patients, visitors, volunteers and staff to meet and dine, which they have not previously been able to do.

DPDS advised the Hospice with a Grant application to the Department of Health, which was successful in gaining the full amount of funding requested (not a common occurrence).

As well as this new shared space, the Grant aided work involved the complete strip out and refurbishment of their commercial kitchen, which is now able to provide delicious hot and cold snacks for the “Heart of the Hospice”, on its daily menu.
